Supervisor Schrantz opened the Special Meeting at 9:00 A.M.

Supervisor Schrantz stated the purpose of this meeting was to discuss and update the Board on the damage the Town incurred from the rain storm last week.

Supervisor Schrantz told the Board he had a conference call on July 16th regarding cleanup kits and help the county was giving. He said there are also forms from Chautauqua County Emergency Services for homeowners to fill out regarding damage they received from the storm.

Highway Superintendent Delcamp told the Board the roads/culverts and bridges within the Town have extensive damage. He gave a conservative estimate of \$400,000 in damages. He told the Board it may be a few months before the Town will here if there is any FEMA money. Mr. Delcamp stated he had planned to oil and stone but that has been put on hold.

Superintendent Delcamp and the Board reviewed prices of pipe and different options to replace the culvert on Woleben Road which is currently closed and has extensive damage.

On a motion of Councilman Manzella, seconded by Councilman Miller the following resolution was ADOPTED Ayes 5 Schrantz, Manzella, Miller, Valentin, Boltz

RESOLVED due to the emergency situation the Portland Town Board authorizes the Highway Superintendent to purchase 120 feet of pipe with 2 lengths and bevels for Woleben Road.

Highway Superintendent Delcamp also stated the pipe on Fish Road needs to be replaced. He said every time there is a hard rain the road gets flooded. Supervisor Schrantz stated this can be discussed at the August Board Meeting, by then the Town may know if there will be any FEMA money.

Supervisor Schrantz read a letter from Chuck Neal on Thayer Hill Road. The letter stated Walker Creek by his home deposited massive debris after the last storm. He stated this is the 3rd time in twelve years this has happened and a permanent solutions needs to be made. The Board discussed this with Highway Superintendent Delcamp, no decision was made.
